Safety Inspections

If a business pays \$15,000 or more for workers' compensation insurance, or if it is self-insured, it must obtain a safety inspection every year. This is required by law.

Here's what you need to know:

When to Complete the Inspection

You must do the inspection within 60 days of starting or renewing your workers' compensation insurance policy.

What to Submit

After completing your inspection, you must send proof to the WCA. This can include a copy of your inspection checklist or other documentation.
